<u>Citrus:</u> We have some Dekopons in the house today. Coming from the same lineage as Sumos, this product looks like a sumo, has better size, and eats just as well if not better. The season is nearing the end, so take a try today before it is too late. Navels continue to be cheap and wonderful.

<u>Pears:</u> We offer Anjou, Bosc, Reds, and Chilean Bartlett's daily. Take note of our pre-conditioned Anjou's from Stemilt. This fruit will taste better than typical pears and bring back return customers.

<u>Chilean Tree Fruit:</u> Sometimes a forgotten piece of winter sales. We do have a selection of good size fruit in the building and I can tell you from first had experience its good!
