Flowers from each group come together to form a bouquet that is stunning. Focal flowers draw the eye while line flowers add height, filler flowers fill in holes, greenery supports and frames the entire bouquet, accent flowers adds colors and shape to your design.

Design Groups



Green is a color that often gets overlooked when creating a design for your flowers. Green foliage adds a beautiful touch of natural beauty to floral designs with added texture, shape and long points. While you may not be crazy about the idea of working with greens, there's a number of choices when it comes to foliage that make your design a wow factor! Here are some of my favorites.



Silver Dollar Euc: It's popular for its longlasting aromatic leaves and its versatility, making it widely used for a number of different occasions throughout the year



Ruscus is a classic, rich green foliage popular for different occasions and design styles. It has a soft effect and is best used when the flowers are the focal point of the design.



Tree fern is a thin, wispy green perfect to use as a filler. Tree fern gives an airy, romantic appearance when paired with delicate colors and flowers.



Leatherleaf is a thicker fern with a triangular shape which adds body and framing to any bouquet or arrangement.



Dusty Miller's gorgeous color gives it a dusted appearance. It pairs well with soft, romantic colors.



Myrtle has small leaves, tall stems and adds a gorgeous texture and smell to floral designs



Bear Grass is an excellent choice for adding unexpected form to bouquets. Typically used to loop into different shapes, bear grass is a favorite among designers for an added touch of interest.

Spray Roses, are perfect for any arrangement! Spray Roses are miniature standard roses that have multiple small blooms per stem. Petite and beautiful, spray roses generally have 3 to 5 heads and are the accent flower.



Alstroemeria flowers feature 3 to 5 blooms on each stem making them a wonderful accent flower. It will be easy to achieve a beautiful look with these beauties.



When bloomed to it's fullest, Lisianthus can resemble a rose. With long layered stems of ruffled blooms these are the perfect elegant addition to any bouquet.



Carnations have a ruffled, ball shape bloom that makes for a super lush look. Standard or mini varieties both make great accents.





Daisies and Poms are a spray flower, meaning that they have more than one bloom on a single stem. This makes them an ideal accent flower for bouquets.





Disbud Flowers feature a single bloom of long, lush petals on each stem. This beautiful flower will add texture and interest to any bouquet.
