

Market Update February 20 2023

## Fruit Update

- **Apples** Bartlett Pears and Jonagold Apples are about to finish the season. Gala and Fuji bags are highly promotable
- **Strawberries** Berry production should be increasing with good supplies available
- Variety Berries Imported Black and Blueberries have great quality and are picking up steam. Will be good to promote for a few weeks. Raspberry volumes are tight and pricing is high
- **Citrus** –Good harvests of California Navels with sizing peaking on 88 and 113 count. Isolated rain does remain an issue with quality
- Stone Fruit Limited volume on imports is keeping prices high
- Grapes Markets are starting to settle with increase arrivals on both coasts. Quality has been excellent
- **Melons** Steady demand with little change to supply with keep prices steady on Cantaloupe. Quality has been good. Honeydews will become tighter as Mexican production wanes







### **Inflation Worries in Customers**

- Inflation is hitting customers in different ways, and perceived inflation is actually changing customer shopping habits.
- Customers are more apt to shopping deals and ads to save money
- While consumers believe that the inflation on groceries is much larger (35.2%) than what it actually is (6.8%) they are still willing to spend more for convenience, with 78% of shoppers saying they would pay more for delivery of groceries





### Veg Update

- Lettuce Good field conditions are allowing planting, weeding, and cultivation to take place. Minimal quality issues and disease pressure in Salinas
- **Celery** Improved supplies this week with strong winds expected. Should not effect the plants much
- **Broccoli & Cauli** Cooler temperatures are slowing growth a tad and making the market higher
- **Onions** Onion prices have started a steady decline with more supply available and less demand after the holidays

Most of the winter vegetables down in California are seeing optimal, if a little cold temps that will spur growth

- **Peppers** –Pepper pricing is looking good with plenty of supplies out there, especially in the colored peppers
- **Asparagus** Hail in growing regions has severely hurt the production. This will effect supplies for a few weeks
- **Tomatoes** Limited crossings from MX have kept prices up but the quality is good.
- Artichokes Southern Coastal and Desert growing regions are going strong. Production is skewing towards the Jumbo sizing



#### **Cantaloupe Fun Facts**

- What we call Cantaloupes are not actual Cantaloupes. Most melons sold under the cantaloupe name in the US are Musk Melons. Real Cantaloupes come from Europe and have a pale green skin
- Cantaloupes derive their name from Cantalupo, Italy where the seeds first arrived from Armenia and were planted in the Papal Gardens in the 16<sup>th</sup> century
- No one knows exactly when the fruit started being popular but it is mentioned in Biblical times from Egypt and Greece









### **Organic Update**

- Apples All varieties are going strong and will continue through the summer. Bagged Galas and Fuji are a great variety to promote
- **Berries** Berry production is looking better this week with more availability of all berries except Raspberries
- **Potatoes** Limited availability which we will see throughout the season
- Onions– Red and Yellow Onions are looking good to promote through February
- Cauli and Broc Production has gotten much better and the prices have adjusted to that
- **Celery** Supplies are getting better with pricing starting to come down
- Lettuces Production and quality are starting to get much better coming out of California
- Citrus– Volume is steady with good opportunities to promote
- **Pears** Bartletts are done for the year but Bosc and Anjou have availability through May
- **Tomatoes –** Good availability and costs will be good enough to promote the next few weeks





### **Hispanic Update**

- **#2 Green Avocados** Plenty available and the larger size has a great price on them
- Cactus Leaf Good quality product with tender leaves
- **Peppers** Jalapeno market has jumped overnight but still a decent supply with good quality
- Mexican Gray Squash Medium sized with decent quality and some material defects
- **Medium Roma Tomatoes** Market is heading higher on these but the quality looks good. Color has a little green to them
- **Maradol Papaya** Quality has been decent with the fruit ready to eat as it hits the stores
- Kent Mangoes– Quality and taste have been excellent. Demand has been outstripping supply so there have been a few gaps
