

Market Update June 12 2023

Fruit Update

- Apples Apple Pricing is steady as packers work on prolonging the season until new crop
- Strawberries

 Strawberry volume is looking very good with some spotty bruising
- Variety Berries All variety berries are still tight going into this week with smaller fruit and lower volumes than expected
- Citrus —Quality is good but pricing is higher than normal with less supply
- Stone Fruit Production is still slow so pricing is high. WA crop should start at the beginning of July
- Grapes Warmer weather is helping the supply of grapes. There is some smaller sizing out there but quality is excellent
- Melons

 Melon quality is getting better every day but Honeydews are way behind their normal picking schedule and remain tight.
- Cherries WA Cherries will begin at the end of this week. Pricing is holding steady but should start falling as California hits their second peak. Rainiers will also start this week out of WA









- Inflation is easing a bit as demand evens out across the board in produce
- YTD 2023 (20 weeks) is showing volume has a slight decline of -.7% and sales dollars are at 1.2% increase
- Even though inflation is slowing down in Produce, grocery is a different story with high inflation across the center store
- The western part of the US has a .2% increase in dollars and .9% increase in units





Veg Update

- Lettuce Steady markets because of moderate demand but good quality and sizing
- Celery Celery saw a spike in demand last week but that has slowed and pricing is starting to come off a tad
- Broccoli & Cauli Quality and Sizing are both doing well with steady demand and pricing
- Onions Most onions are coming out of California with Walla Walla Sweet onions starting next week

Local WA product is getting started with leafy veggies and Cherries. More Stone fruit will start in a few weeks

- Peppers Peppers are a getting a bit tighter but quality and supply should stay steady
- Asparagus WA Asparagus is done for the season.
 MX quality has been great in the 11# boxes
- Tomatoes
 – Tomatoes are still looking good with great quality and decent supplies
- Brussel Sprouts Quality and supply has struggled and will continue for a few more weeks
- Artichokes Northern Cali has started up and the quality is excellent



Unit Movement and Sales

- Berries are leading the category again with 2.5% increase in sales and -1.9% decrease in units
- Apples continue struggling with -2.2% in sales dollars and 5.2% in units as they had a short crop and higher costs
- Potatoes are still showing lots of inflation with 12.7% increase in sales dollars and -4.1% in volume
- Grapes and melons are showing increases in volume and sales dollars with Grapes at a 3.4% increase in sales and 1.3% in units and melons at 6.7% in sales and 6.1% in units









Organic Update

- Apples OG Pinks are done for the year but all other varieties are doing well. Bagged Galas and Fuji are still available for promotions
- Berries

 Strawberries and blueberries are available with raspberries and blackberries being very tight
- Potatoes
 — Potatoes are very hard to come by and will be like that until new crop
- Onions

 Same boat as the potatoes now with very little quality onions out there
- Cauli and Broc Pricing has come down with the increased volume and quality
- Celery Lots of insect and disease pressure is leading to high prices and low availability
- Lettuces Steady supplies and modest demand are holding prices flat
- Citrus
 – OG Citrus is finished or at the very end of its lifespan for the next few weeks
- Pears Anjou's are the last pear standing with good quality for the next few months
- Tomatoes Great availability and quality for the next couple weeks. Best time to promote!











Hispanic Update

- #2 Green Avocados Plenty available and the larger size has a great price on them
- Cactus Leaf Very popular item all through the summer
- Mexican Green Onions

 Great item to promote the next few weeks
- Mexican Gray Squash Medium sized with decent quality and some material defects
- Medium Roma Tomatoes

 Still gapping but should start seeing more availability late next week
- Maradol Papaya
 — Good quality with ready to eat color and taste. Market is firm right now
- Mangoes
 – Mangoes are at their peak season so the quality is excellent. Should be a great push item throughout the summer.
- Chile Peppers

 Quality is still a little suspect but getting better as production ramps up
- Limes

 Plenty of limes out of the Mexican market the last few weeks have led to great pricing





Corn Husks

- Mainly used in Tamale cooking with a corn based dough mixture
- Banana leaves can also be used to make Tamales, but Corn Husks are how they have historically been made
- Tamales have been cooked for almost 9,000 years and can be traced back to the Aztecs, Mayans, and Incans
- Corn husks are used to celebrate the Atamalcualiztli festival that honors the corn god
- March 23rd is unofficially National Tamale Day around the US
